
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


5 POINTS TO SUCCESS

- Excellent posture all the time
 - Look confident and GLOW
- Low breath
 - Suspend, breathe through the hinges, shock breath
- Vowel matching
 - We don't sing the same as we speak
- Lift the sound
 - Bright forward placement
- Forget it!









- Vowel Matching
 - Voice placement is very important
 - Bright forward sound
 - Sing American Vowels
- Finding the match
 - Key kid kayde kahd kohd kudd
 - Duet to find the match
- Don't sing words
 - Sing vowels and pass consonants on to the next word
 - Example Let me call you sweet heart

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5 POINTS TO SUCCESS

Let me call you sweetheart, I'm in love with you

Bn or Bng sound first for forward placement

Always start with "Have" and move in sequence to the desired vowel; Add 'aer' as in 'hair' to "a" and "e" words eg: Let, Get, Bet, Land, Jazz and Have

Use "eh" in Make, Take, Late before diphthong



Be careful!

Ah Versus Aw



- Lift the sound
 - Forward bright placement
- What does it look like?
 - Show top teeth
 - Use upper lip muscles, lips off teeth
 - Keep a smile in the eyes at all times
 - Heavy tongue = more space in the mouth
- Posture and breathing will help
 - Anchor the neck
 - Breathe into the top of the head
